This year marks a milestone year for the Omaha Catholic School Consortium and we have much to celebrate in 2020. Nine years ago our east Omaha parishes and schools began experiencing

the impact of changing demographics as families relocated to the suburbs and immigrants moved into the neighborhood. Our Catholic schools in southeast Omaha experienced declining enrollment and diminishing financial resources. As a result, the archdiocese launched Promise 2020. It was an initiative that realigned area parishes and schools to better serve the Catholic families in southeast Omaha.

The impact of Promise 2020 has been profound. Our Catholic school students have benefited greatly, and the Consortium remains committed to providing accessible and affordable Catholic education to the families in southeast Omaha.

We are proud of our accomplishments to date and have ambitious goals as we look beyond Promise 2020.

A Promise to Grow

As of 2019-2020, our five original schools are flourishing and have moved beyond surviving, to thriving, as enrollment has trended upwards with an over 30% increase since our inception. This growth is unprecedented in a time when most small parish schools in working-class and urban neighborhoods across the nation are closing. While many schools across America are barely hanging on, Promise 2020 gave us the framework to build and enhance a sustainable model that supports our network of schools.

The Consortium model is a proven one. By centralizing tasks like payroll and HR, we achieve efficiencies, giving cost- and time-savings back to our schools. We believe our network of schools is key to our sustainability. And we remain committed to growing our schools through professional marketing to build community awareness and expand our digital presence.

A Promise to be Accountable and Transparent

The Consortium is built on sound governance, strong leadership, financial accountability and transparency, educational innovation and continuous improvement.

We are committed to:

- making a systemic shift from a traditional funding model to a stewardship model that is driven by partnerships and strategic investments from the community
- streamlining back-office functions to reduce overhead and administrative

costs, making tuition more affordable and Catholic education more accessible

We continue to jump-start our students' futures by implementing innovative academic programs and introducing cutting-edge curriculum in all of our Consortium schools. 




COST TO EDUCATE PER STUDENT (K-EIGHTH GRADE)

ENROLLMENT TOTALS - ALL CONSORTIUM SCHOOLS (PRE-SCHOOL THROUGH 8TH GRADE)





EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

We believe a positive early childhood education will shape a child's attitude toward education, and we work to ensure a nurturing environment where young children can thrive.



All Consortium schools have preschool and preK options. Two of our schools - Holy Cross and St. Thomas More - have a transitional kindergarten program to ensure kindergarten readiness. Transitional kindergarten is for students who meet age requirements for kindergarten but could benefit from one more year to develop the fundamental academic and social skills for future success in school.

The COVID-19 pandemic required our schools to reimagine how students could learn and succeed from home. More than 125 classroom teachers between the six schools transitioned to a remote environment with just about 48 hours to prepare.

"The efforts of our teachers proved each to be resilient and dedicated classroom leaders, as they adapted their curriculum and assignments to be accessed online or created packets of materials for our students to work at home," said Chris Nelson, outgoing executive director.

All throughout spring, the Consortium schools were able to provide continuous learning opportunities for our students so they were able to progress and excel in both their academic and spiritual lives.

During this time, we leaned heavily on our partnerships with parents.

Consortium educators went above and beyond to put in extra time and effort to reach out to families more than ever before. But we're truly so grateful for how those at home with our students stepped up.

These relationships between school and family allow for a more enhanced opportunity to understand the full education experience - the whole child approach that we take.

"We tried to pull in-school traditions into homes of families as much as possible so it felt familiar," said Lynn Schultz, principal at St. Bernadette.

MEET MRS. ASHLEY JENSEN, PREKINDERGARTEN TEACHER OUR LADY OF LOURDES CATHOLIC SCHOOL

If the Jensen last name sounds familiar, it may be because Ashley's husband, mother-in-law and sister-in-law all work for different Catholic schools in the Omaha Metro area.

Her twin daughters also attend a Catholic school.

"As you may be able to tell by my family's involvement in Catholic education, we are really passionate about Catholic schools."



"Personally, I find it a true mission and calling to help students and colleagues develop a personal relationship with God. I actually consider it some of the most important work anyone on this earth can do."

Prior to becoming a teacher, Ashley grew up in northwest Iowa. She graduated from Briar Cliff University and has now nearly completed her Masters from Creighton University in both of the areas of Early Childhood and English as a Second Language (ESL).

She will be the only teacher in the Archdiocese of Omaha that we're aware of with these advanced degrees.

After teaching kindergarten for a few years at **Our Lady of Lourdes**, Ashley was asked to step into a prekindergarten teaching position. While hesitant, she accepted - and she thrived! This was around the same time the archdiocese announced Ignite the Faith grant funds were available to help teachers continue their education.

"I was starting to see God's plan for me"

"I was starting to see God's plan for me," she said. "I found myself excited to learn more about the diversity and equity in education for our littlest learners. It is important for us, as educators and parents, to realize that a child's purpose is not to be grown up. A child's purpose is to be a child. They are fully made in God's image, just as they are. Giving my students that due time, the respect for their growth and development as God intended, at their rate of discovery, is how I choose to serve. I really didn't see this passion until I started my degree work."

She said this has been a process through which she can now look back and see God's hand guiding her.

"I learned more about child development and the importance of a child's family, community and past experiences impacting the learning process and vision of the world. I now feel called to use my newfound knowledge to advocate for early learners, and also to encourage other educators in my role as a Lighthouse coach for the archdiocese."


