Our Catholic schools are special places.



At the Consortium, we help our children learn what is good, holy and beautiful in our world. Our schools prepare our students academically and to think critically. But what sets the Consortium schools apart is that they teach our students to learn how to love, to be kind, to pray and to trust in the Lord.

The challenges of the past year caused all of us to take pause, much like Jonathan did that day on the playground. We owe a great deal of gratitude to our teachers and administrators for finding a way to keep our schools open and safe while also keeping students focused and learning. Our teachers went above and beyond - remote options were

offered, safety measures were taken and all six of our buildings were open for learning the entire school year.

Today, we are stronger and more resilient, and we move forward with confidence as we focus on the 2021-2022 school year.

We plan to continue to:

- Challenge our students academically with new curriculum plans for reading and math and improved instructional practices, as well as increased opportunities for students to grow in their relationship with Jesus
- Improve our operational efficiencies by cost sharing, streamlining business processes and being good stewards of our charitable gifts so more money goes to teaching and learning
- Support our teachers as we greatly increase our efforts to provide improved and competitive compensation
- Enhance our governance model by diversifying our board and creating plans for a parent advisory group to offer more input from our largest group of stakeholders
- Deepen our relationship with our 16 supporting parishes and pastors to offer stronger spiritual guidance and support to our students and families
- Increase early childhood enrollment in our schools, offering the opportunity of a Catholic education to more families, as we energize our retreat programs

Thank you for supporting the Consortium schools in South Omaha and providing our children with the opportunity to have a relationship with Jesus in a safe, faith-filled learning environment surrounded by kind and caring friends and teachers.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE



Friends of the Consortium,

To say this year was a phenomenal year for the Omaha Catholic School Consortium would be

quite an understatement.

The first phenomena was being in-school for in person learning all school year long for all six of our schools, while offering a remote learning option. This was due to excellent work by our teachers, staff and administrators combined with strong support from our students and their families. Everyone worked together to cooperate with many new procedures, including taking temperatures, new drop off and pickup procedures, lots of hand washing, spreading out in classrooms and the cafeteria and the biggest adjustment of all - everyone wearing masks. This diligence and cooperation along with lots of prayers worked, as we had minimal virus cases. Even though many families decided to keep their preschoolers, prekindergarteners and even kindergartners home, resulting in a noticeable enrollment decline, we were truly blessed!

The second phenomena was the federal government providing our schools with significant funding focused on improving health and safety and addressing the learning gap. We used a portion of these funds to purchase cleaning equipment and supplies. The bulk of these funds are being utilized to update our curriculum materials for math, science and social studies with some updates to our already current reading curriculum. Our Education Director, Chris Nelson, is leading the effort with participation from our teachers and administrators to select new curricula that will be purposefully implemented over the

next few years. We fully expect these curriculum updates to have a positive impact on our standardized test scores.

The third phenomena we encountered was the increased challenge of income instability that many of our families encountered due to the pandemic. Whether it be job loss, illness or other related factors, many of our families stepped forward and asked for additional tuition assistance. Our Consortium team takes great pride in not turning students away due to the inability to pay. Growing support from donors helped to ease the strain this additional tuition assistance placed on the Consortium budget.

One of our big challenges is to replace the federal funds that were available the last two years. We are focused on growing our development efforts along with working with our families to continue growing the strong support they provide.

Thanks to our donors and friends for your financial support and prayers. Please continue to keep the Omaha Catholic School Consortium in your prayers as we strive to fulfill our mission of bringing an affordable and sustainable Catholic education to the community through nurturing and culturally diverse school environments.






GAP BETWEEN TUITION AND FEES AND THE COST TO EDUCATE




ENROLLMENT TRENDS

INNOVATIVE & SUPPORTIVE ENVIRONMENTS

Holy Cross

One beloved tradition at **Holy Cross** is the Field Day teams, which was kept alive even through the pandemic. Each eighth grader leads a team and has a team member from every grade, from transitional kindergarten to eighth grade. This allows for fellowship and camaraderie, in addition to all of the fun. This is one of many examples that demonstrate the sense of belonging and community that our Falcon families enjoy.



Mass buddies are another way the school builds relationships between students of all grade levels. Younger students are partnered with older students who sit next to them at Mass. The older students act as role models and examples of our faith. Students stay connected to their Mass buddies long after they have changed grades which helps develop those positive relationships in the building.

Sts. Peter and Paul

Sts. Peter and Paul continued year two of its program in partnership with the National Center for Families to support and improve literacy outcomes for English language learners. This past year, 20 families were enrolled between two cohorts who commit seven hours per week. Parents/guardians have the opportunity to attend English classes and parenting classes at no charge, as well as receive additional support in navigating local community resources available to them.

Parent participants also get to attend occasional classes with their children to improve literacy.



Many of our families create spiritual goals as well as academic and family goals. One common goal is to pray the rosary daily as a family. Another family is working toward reading the Bible more with their children. Still another is to learn the Our Father, the Hail Mary, and the Glory Be in English, as a step toward being able to participate in Mass in English.

"The community that has developed is close, supportive and unique,' says Vickie Hecker, Family Enrichment Coordinator at SPP.

Dual Language Academy

Dual Language Academy students reside in 29 different zip codes. Celebrating and honoring the many cultures our students come from is an important part of the school community.

Our Lady of Lourdes

OLL is home to Mrs. JC Weaver, third grade teacher who also acts as the school's Lighthouse Teacher. As such, she provides ongoing coaching to new and veteran teachers throughout the year. The program is in year three and is facilitated by the Catholic Schools Office. Last year, teachers recorded themselves in the classroom and Mrs. Weaver used her training to guide fellow teachers through self-reflection based upon the Jim Knight coaching principles for effective instruction. This is one way OLL stays focused on continuous improvement.

St. Thomas More

This past summer, STM was excited to offer a Summer Day Camp program to families with half- or full-day options. Running from early June through late July, weekly themes for students to enjoy included: Ocean and Water Week, Gardening, Cooking, Science, Art, Nature and more. Unsurprisingly with the heat, water week was the most popular! Feedback from the families served through this summer program was full of gratitude for the school providing these fun-filled, safe and affordable care options for the community.



St. Bernadette

The twenty eight students in the Class of 2021 from **St. Bernadette** earned 16 different scholarships. Eighty two percent of SBS eighth graders matriculated to a local Catholic high school.



Academic growth and love of learning are main focuses. For the second year, **St. Bernadette** continued a 1:1 technology program in grades 5-8, with each middle schooler receiving a Chromebook. Previously, teachers were sharing devices, which limited their ability to do more innovative projects. With readily accessible technology, teachers continued to differentiate and personalize instruction. This is one of many ways in which Consortium students become prepared for success in high school.

MINDING THE GAP: STUDENT PROGRESS THROUGH THE PANDEMIC

The school year looked very different with social distancing, masks, shields, temperature checks, self-screening and more. We are proud of how we kept staff and students from all six of our buildings safe. But we also know that all of the protocols take a toll on the social, emotional and academic wellbeing of all in our communities.



That's why administering assessments to both students and staff was important for us, to help understand where people were and what steps we needed to take.

Assessment data from Fall 2020 showed that students across our six schools, on average, started school behind where we would expect them to be in both math and reading, due to remote learning the prior spring.

However, students took the same assessments in spring 2021, and scores from all grades showed marked improvement in student achievement measuring at or above grade level.

Oldalis Salgado, parent of OLL student More than 100 teachers throughout our schools used this data, along with their collective years experience, new professional development training and blended learning tools to help close learning gaps and accelerate students' learning.

More than that, a separate assessment of students, staff and families at our schools in late spring 2021 showed us that progress was also made in terms of social and emotional needs. Most students who were surveyed reported feeling highly respected and cared for by their teachers.
