DUAL LANGUAGE ACADEMY TO OPEN IN FALL

The Omaha Catholic School Consortium is now accepting applications for pre-school, pre-kindergarten and kindergarten students to attend its Dual Language Academy at St. Stanislaus Early Childhood Education Center opening this fall.

WHAT IS THE DUAL LANGUAGE ACADEMY?

- In partnership with Our Lady of Lourdes and Sts. Peter and Paul schools, the Dual Language Academy will begin at the start of the 2018-2019 school year and will be held at the Early Childhood Education Center located at St. Stanislaus School, 41st and J Streets.
- This innovative educational model brings together native English speakers and native Spanish speakers so they may learn together and serve as language models for one another.
- Dual Language classrooms include all subject areas as well keeping true to the Catholic identity.



- Dual Language curriculum will be implemented with inaugural pre-school, pre-kindergarten and kindergarten classes and each year will add one grade level, through eighth grade.

HOW WILL IT BENEFIT OUR STUDENTS?

- Students who attend the Academy will become bilingual and biliterate.
- Research shows students in dual language immersion programs begin to outperform their English-

only peers as early as third and fourth grade and continue to do so through high school.

- Consortium schools were chosen to be a part of a five-year partnership with Boston College's Two-Way Immersion Network for Catholic Schools—TWIN-CS, which has been successfully mentoring schools across the United States since 2012.


